

2026 Senior League Event Descriptions

2 Person & Team events: 90% of handicap

Individual events: 100% of handicap

- 1) Peoria Scoring: (No handicap required) Before teeing off, 6 of the 18 holes will be selected. Each player's score on the selected holes will be totaled and used to convert a handicap for the day. The actual score minus the player's handicap will determine the Net Score Winner.
- 2) Individual Low Net: The total score minus total handicap.
- 3) 2-Person Best Ball: The best net score between you and your partner per hole is utilized. The team with the lowest overall score wins. If there are only 3 in your foursome the Pro Shop will blind draw a partner for you. Partners will be top 2 and bottom 2 players on the scorecard.
- 4) (May 4th Event) 2-3 Ball Variation 1: 2 best of 4 on odd holes, 3 best of 4 on the even holes

(August 26th) 2-3 Ball Variation 2: 2 best of 4 on front nine, 3 best of 4 on back nine

- 5) 2 Best of 4: On each hole the 2 best of 4 net scores will count towards the game.

- 6) Low Putts: Player who has the lowest putts for 18 holes will be the winner. A “putt” only counts when you are on the green. If you putt from the fringe or fairway that does not count towards your total putts.

- 7) Best Ball 4-Some: On each hole the best net score will count towards the game results.

- 8) (July 22nd Event) 1-2-3 Ball Variation 1: Holes 1-6 1 ball counts, hole 7-12 2 balls count, holes 13-18 3 Balls count

(August 12th Event) 1-2-3 Ball Variation 2: Hole 1 one ball counts, hole 2 two balls count and hole 3 three balls count. Hole 4 repeat process starting with one ball counts, hole 5 two balls count and hole 6 three balls count

(September 2nd Event) 1-2-3 Ball Variation 3: par 3’s one ball counts, par 4’s two balls count and par 5’s three balls count

- 9) 2-Person Low Net: Both players (top 2 and bottom 2 on the scorecard) will add their rounds together then apply their handicap strokes to get your total score. If you are a group of 3 you will receive a blind draw.

- 10) 2 Best of 4 Chicago Points: The winner is the group whose point total for 18 holes is the highest. Points are awarded based on your net score for each hole. The point system is 3 for Eagle, 2 for Birdie, 1 for Par and 0 for Bogey and -1 for a Double Bogey or worse. The best 2 of 4 net scores on each hole are what will be used for the game.
- 11) 3 Best of 4: The 3 of 4 best net scores on each hole will be counted towards the game.
- 12) Club Championship: The senior club championship is a 3 round event where your two of three best rounds will count for the tournament. If you play all 3 rounds, we toss out your worst round. If you only play 2 rounds, they will both count for the tournament. The scoring format will be the same as individual low net.
- 13) 3 Best of 4 Chicago Points: The winner is the group whose point total for 18 holes is the highest. Points are awarded based on your net score for each hole. The point system is 3 for Eagle, 2 for Birdie, 1 for Par and 0 for Bogey and -1 for a Double Bogey or worse. The best 3 of 4 net scores on each hole are what will be used for the game.
- 14) 3 Odd – 2 Even: On the odd holes 3 best of 4 net scores will count towards the game, on the even holes 2 best of 4 net scores will count towards the game.

- 15) 2 Odd – 3 Even: On the odd holes 2 best of 4 net scores will count towards the game, on the even holes 3 best of 4 net scores will count towards the game.
- 16) 2 By 4: 2 best of 4, except there are 4 random holes where ALL balls count.
- 17) Best Odd Holes with Handicaps: Only the odd holes will count towards the game, your handicap strokes are applied.
- 18) Best Even Holes with Handicaps: Only the even holes will count towards the game, your handicap strokes are applied.
- 19) Senior Championship: Two-day event that spans over a Saturday and Sunday. It is a 36-hole stroke play individual low net event. There is a gross division that plays from the white tees and a net division that plays from the gold tees. Scoring is the same as individual low net

20) Scramble: everyone in the group tees off. From there you select the ball from where you want to play the next shot from. The other players in the group pick up and place their ball next to the selected shot. You do this on every shot all the way around the course, including on your putts.

If you are a group of 3 players, each hole one player in the group will hit 2 shots. The extra shot is rotated evenly among the group over the course of the round.

The handicap allocation is 25% for the player with the lowest handicap, 20%, 15% and 10% for the player with the highest handicap in the group

21) Individual Stableford – You will earn points for your net score on each hole. An eagle is worth 3 points, 2 for a birdie, 1 for par, 0 for bogey and -1 for double or worse. The winner in each flight will be the person who earns the most points.

22) Callaway scoring - It's a "worst holes" system that uses a player's up to six worst holes in a round to calculate a handicap. The handicap is then subtracted from the player's gross score to calculate their net score. The winner of the tournament is determined by comparing the net scores of all players.
